- We are recognized as purposeful, results-oriented, open and accessible, and consistently striving for improvement

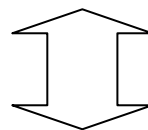


### Strategic Areas for Improvement

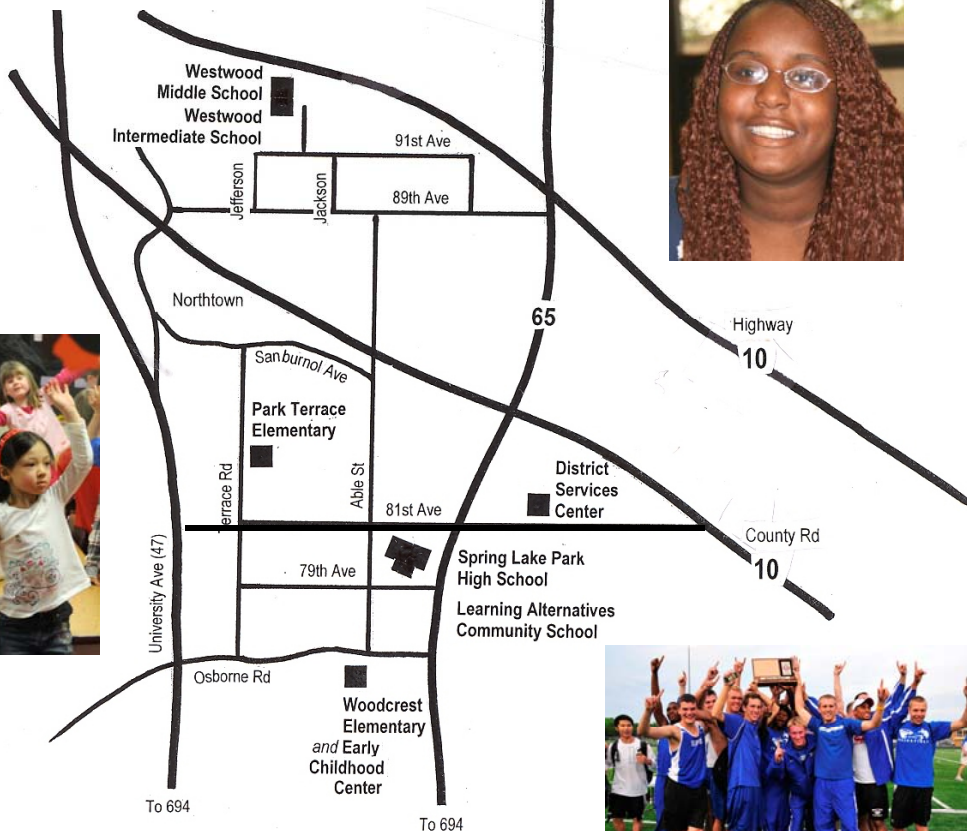
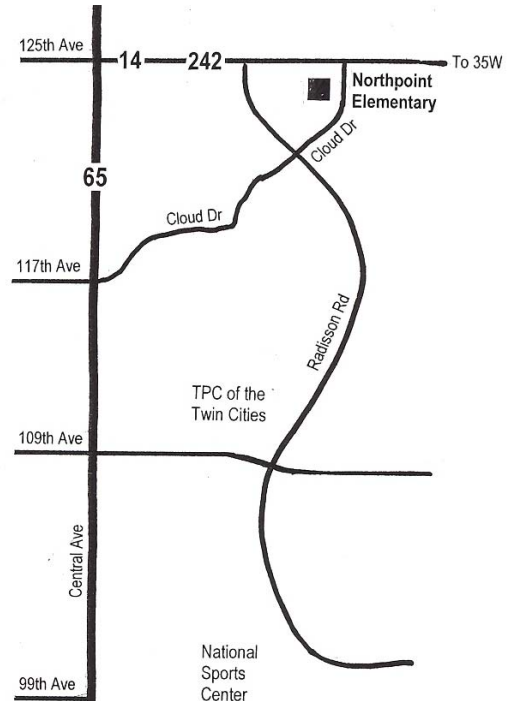

There is much to be proud of and excited about, including the completion of our project to renovate and expand all of our schools, incredible student success, and a vision for the future and roadmap to ensure student achievement and success.

Our list is larger, but here is a variety pack of 50 of the reasons why we are proud—and why we think you should be proud—of the Spring Lake Park School District.

## 50 REASONS WHY WE'RE PROUD OF OUR STUDENTS, STAFF, PARENTS, COMMUNITY BLAINE • SPRING LAKE PARK • FRIDLEY



*95 percent of all Spring Lake Park High School graduates have post-secondary plans to attend two- or four-year colleges and universities or the military.*

- 1** In 2010, nearly 95 percent of Spring Lake Park High School graduating seniors had plans in place for two-year or four-year colleges and universities or the military.
- 2** National experts have identified District 16 as a model site for engaging staff in consistent high quality professional learning experiences to improve student learning.
- 3** In 2010, Spring Lake Park High School had one National Merit Scholarship winner, two Finalists, six Commended students, and another recognized in the Black Americans category.
- 4** Opportunities in Emergency Care teams from the high school placed 1st and 2nd in the nation in the International Rescue and Emergency Care Association Competition in 2009, and 1st, 3rd, and 5th in the state in the Minnesota Youth Emergency Care Competition in 2010.
- 5** A recent Lighthouse Program student graduated at age 14, was 5th in his senior class, and received a full college scholarship.

**6** 7th graders from Westwood Middle School placed 1st in the multi-state region of national Continental Math League competition in 2010.

**7** A recent graduate obtained a perfect ACT score; one of only 3 in Minnesota, 33 in the nation.

**8** A junior in the district's Lighthouse Program advanced to the semi-finals of the competition to become a member of the 2010 U.S. Physics Olympic Team.

**9** Our elementary-level Spanish Immersion Program, now in its second year, is a school-within-a-school at the Westwood Complex.

**10** Every teacher is engaged in professional learning and development to better personalize instruction for each student, in each classroom, in each school in the district.

**11** Since 2004, the community-based Panther Foundation has given over a quarter of a million dollars to the Spring Lake Park School District through grant awards and funding of special projects.

**12** Twenty-six elementary students were tops in the nation with perfect scores in four recent national academic Olympiads.

**13** Since 2008, Special Education referrals decreased by more than 50 percent with the implementation of our System of Interventions.

**14** All facilities are expanded and completely remodeled. The Minnesota Construction Association awarded its top Award of Excellence to Northpoint Elementary School and Spring Lake Park High School.

**15** Nearly two hundred of our teachers have successfully implemented innovative 21st Century technologies in their classrooms over the past three years, supported by their participation in year-long study groups.

**16** In 2009-10, Academic Section or Conference honors earned for football, girls tennis, gymnastics, and cross country teams. State appearances for track, wrestling, swimming & diving, and dance. Section or conference championships in volleyball, boys tennis, boys track, softball, and dance.

**17** Our Learning Alternatives Community School, a Minnesota Alternative Program of the Year, has implemented project-based learning to address real world problems and issues.

**18** Our Early Childhood Program was awarded a \$40,000 Hand-in-Hand grant to improve school readiness, health, and the well-being of students whose first language is not English.

**19** The high school's Pantherettes Dance Team was 4th in the state in 2010, third in the state in 2009 and 2008; state champions in 2007, 2006, and 2005.

**20** Six of Minnesota's top-ten-scoring high school students in an International Chemistry Olympiad qualifying test were from Spring Lake Park High School.

**21** Every staff member –every teacher, cook, principal, secretary, para, custodian— is committed to making positive, lasting connections with our students, and to providing a welcoming environment for parents and the community.



*Ninth in the nation! This sixth grade academic team from Westwood Middle School excelled in WordMasters national computer-based language arts competition.*

**22** David Backes, a 2002 alum, had a game-winning goal on the Silver Medal-winning U.S. team in the XXI Winter Olympic Games. He is a member of the St. Louis Blues NHL hockey team.

**23** Spring Lake Park hosted a two-day workshop on Habits of Mind thinking skills with authors who are nationally and internationally recognized as experts, as well as an academy for principals from across the state to develop their leadership skills.

**24** Teachers across the district collaborate weekly in Professional Learning Community teams focused on student outcomes, assessments, instruction, and results.

**25** Ten Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) students won awards at the service organization's state competition in 2010.

**26** Westwood Middle School 6th graders placed 9th in the nation in the 2010 WordMasters, a national language arts competition.

**27** All secondary students have a myPanthers account providing access to a district email account and Google Docs.

**28** Six students won nine state-level medals at the 2010 SkillsUSA-Minnesota competition showcasing high school and college technical education students.

**29** Spring Lake Park High School academic teams had two 1st place awards, a 2nd, and a 3rd in the state Health Occupations of America competition in 2010.

**30** All teachers engage in continuous professional learning opportunities focused on differentiation, authentic instruction, and building meaningful relationships.

**31** The staff at Westwood Middle School does much to support the importance of a high school diploma and of college readiness, including taking all 8th graders –that's over 300—on a field trip to the University of Minnesota.

**32** Three coordinators serve the needs of K-12 students in the well-respected Gifted Services Department.

**33** All principals are instructional leaders who are in classrooms each week to support and acknowledge high quality instruction and student learning.

**34** The high school boys basketball team placed 4th in the 2009 and 2007 state tournaments.

**35** Our high school provides each 9th and 10th grader with a small core group of teachers they work with all year long. This results in teachers getting to know the academic, social, and emotional needs of each student and a more personalized experience in students' transition to high school.

**36** Katelin Rains, a 2005 alum, earned three consecutive national pole vault records at Minnesota State University-Mankato.

**37** First in the state to implement the Practical Assessment Exploration System which increases real life skills in Transition Students.

**38** Schools have computer labs and laptop carts; classrooms are equipped with state-of-the-art instructional technology, many with SMART boards.

**39** The VOICE, a high school peer education theater group, received an award for promoting mental health awareness in Anoka County.

**40** All preschool-12th grade students participate in learning experiences that foster higher-order thinking, substantive conversations, and connections to the world beyond the classroom.

**40** Family and student communication include an up-to-date website; E-News providing email for information and alerts; cable television programming of School Board meetings, concerts, and topical information; publications; and more.

**41** Troy Merritt, 2004 alum, won the 2009 PGA Tour Qualifying Tournament, preceded by an NCAA-record five tourney wins in a row in college.

**42** Responsive Classroom practices at the elementary emphasize social, emotional, and academic growth in a strong, close, and safe school community.

**43** An academic team from the Lighthouse Program placed 1st in the state in the Minnesota Stock Market Game.

**45** Over \$60,000 in local scholarships from service organizations, businesses, and individuals to one-third of our high school seniors.

**46** Three students participated in the 2010 National Junior High Chess Championship sponsored by the United States Chess Federation.

**47** Staff take extreme pride in maintaining clean, safe, and welcoming schools and grounds.

**48** Two of our students, a 12-year-old piano-player and a 10-year old tap-dancer, were selected to perform in a commercial for "America's Got Talent." One also captured the pre-teen title at the Minnesota State Fair Talent Show.

**49** Successful online learning program offers individualized online curriculum and instruction—leading to a high school degree—via computer from home or anywhere.

**50** And, finally, School District 16 is extremely proud of its supportive school community that values education.

Spring Lake Park School District 16 encompasses all of the City of Spring Lake Park, half of the City of Blaine, and a portion of the City of Fridley.



*The area is both vibrant and secluded, yet close to the core of the metropolitan area, District 16 is proud of its school-community partnerships in an involved and supportive community of 25,000.*

*New housing developments, including The Lakes, Deacon's Walk/Tournament Players Club, The Sanctuary, and Pleasure Creek have brought new vitality to previously undeveloped areas. The Northstar commuter rail project is a great new addition to the area.*

*Our school district community is home to the National Sports Center Olympic Training Facilities, USA Cup—the largest youth soccer tournament in the world, 3M PGA Seniors Championship, and TPC Twin Cities championship golf course.*

*You'll also find the Minnesota Medical Enterprise Park, Medtronic, Unity Hospital, Anoka County Human Services Center, Anoka Ramsey Community College, and Northtown Regional Shopping Center in the District 16 school community.*

*In addition, the area is home to Majestic Oaks, Bunker Hills, and Chomonix Golf Courses; Banfill-Locke Center for the Arts; Bunker Hills Regional Park and Bunker Beach Water Park; Sandhill Crane Nature Area; Wargo Nature Center; and Springbrook Nature Center.*

## SCHOOL READINESS AND PRESCHOOL

School Readiness is a public school program for all children ages 3-5. The goal of School Readiness is to help preschoolers enter school with the skills and behaviors necessary to be successful in future learning.

Licensed teachers make learning fun through creative experiences that teach skills in math, science, literacy, social interactions, and the arts.

All preschool classes use a curriculum that is aligned with School District 16's kindergarten goals. Two, three, or four days-a-week classes are offered in the morning or afternoon.

Classes are held at Woodcrest Elementary School in Fridley and Northpoint Elementary School in Blaine. We offer a sliding fee scale based on income and family size to ensure every family has the opportunity to participate in our programs.

Spring Lake Park School District students begin their school experience in the engaging atmosphere of one of our three K-3 elementary schools, located in our three cities. **Northpoint** in Blaine, **Park Terrace** in Spring Lake Park, and **Woodcrest** in Fridley.

All elementary students then enter **Westwood Intermediate School** in Blaine for grades 4 and 5, which is on the same campus as the grades 6-8 middle school, allowing students to be on the same campus for five years of their middle years development.

Staff members recognize that each child is continually developing and therefore continuously value instruction, student learning, and programs in an effort to provide the finest educational experience for children.

The Strategic Directions established by the School Board, improvement initiatives defined by administration, and the essential learning outcomes within each curriculum area provide the basis for learning.

The elementary instructional program emphasizes the core instructional areas of language arts, mathematics, social studies, and science, as well as instruction in art, music, health, and physical education.

In addition, each teacher implements Responsive Classroom practices that involve starting each day with a classroom morning meeting that sets the agenda and expectations for the day.

Integrated use of technology is standard practice at all grade levels.

As an example of the Spring Lake Park School District's desire to best provide for each child's educational growth, there are cluster programs for gifted and talented children in each school and in all of the elementary grades.

In addition, instructional support is provided for our English Language Learners, both in and out of the regular classroom, as is assistance for students needing additional help in Basic Skills in reading and/or math.

Children who have special education needs are served in all elementary schools.

## SPANISH IMMERSION PROGRAM

Our Spanish Immersion Program –for kindergarten and first grade students in 2010-2011— is now in its second year. The program is located at the Westwood site. Immersion offers parents a choice for their child to become fluent in another language while learning the core elementary program.

### SECONDARY LEVEL

Spring Lake Park School District secondary schools are focused on preparing all high school graduates to successfully attend higher education if they so desire.

By building on the core skills learned in elementary school, teachers at **Westwood Middle School** and **Spring Lake Park High School** work with each student on the goal of high achievement for all.

The staff at each of our secondary schools establish learning-centered schools through high expectations for all students while building relationships so each student is welcomed and feels connected within our schools.

It is our goal that each student experiences personalized planning to meet the established expectations, and is provided with frequent and meaningful opportunities to assess academic and social progress with a faculty member.

Personalized instruction, special education services, gifted and talented education support, and a system of interventions in each school provide students with the resources they need to meet those high expectations.

Each teacher at Westwood Middle School and Spring Lake Park High School meets with colleagues regularly to clarify student

learning expectations, assess the progress of individual students, and make interventions as appropriate.

Both secondary schools provide a broad co-curricular program in athletics, academics, and the fine arts.



### WESTWOOD MIDDLE SCHOOL

Westwood Middle School (grades 6-8) is designed to meet the unique needs of early adolescent students. Each student is assigned to a grade level team where he/she is provided many opportunities to explore a wide variety of subjects through an age-appropriate curriculum.

The grade level teams consist of a core group of teachers who work with approximately 75 students per math and language arts teacher to doubly stress the importance of these content areas and 150 students per social studies and science teacher. They strive to maintain close contact with these students' families. Through this model, closer connections are made between teachers, students, and parents.

The PRIDE advisory program focuses on the individual student, providing emotional, social, academic and physical development within the context of a supportive and stable peer group.

The school has been totally renovated and expanded over the past few years.

### SPRING LAKE PARK HIGH SCHOOL

Spring Lake Park High School (grades 9-12) students receive extensive guidance and personalized planning through an advisory program where students remain together with the same advisor for four years.

All ninth and tenth grade students begin their high school experience in a "small learning community" of approximately 100 students working with a core group of four teachers. This facilitates the development of staff and student relationships and eases students into their high school experience.

Students are provided with a wide array of opportunities and choices, while also being provided with a strong core program in the areas of mathematics, science, social studies, language arts, and physical education.

In addition to the core curricular areas, students have the opportunity to participate in music or our nationally-recognized Opportunities in Emergency Care program or take a course in world language, business and computer technology, art, industrial technology, or family and consumer science.

We highly encourage students to participate in our advanced learning opportunities: 12 advanced placement courses for college credit, honors courses, and a College in the Schools program. Individual interest can be pursued through independent study.

We also offer a wide array of support and opportunities for those students who may be struggling with their learning.

Technology facilities, the media center, computer labs, and well-equipped science classrooms help prepare learners to be successful in post-secondary education programs.

A 2006-09 renovation and expansion makes Spring Lake Park High School a nearly-new school.

### LEARNING ALTERNATIVES COMMUNITY SCHOOL

Recognized as a Minnesota Alternative Program of the Year, Learning Alternatives Community School (LACS) is for learners between the ages of 12 and 21 who are seeking success in an alternative setting. Instruction is individualized, learner-directed, and flexible. LACS offers a full-time day program and a dual enrollment program in which students can be enrolled in their high school by day and attend LACS after school.

LACS also offers an independent study program and summer school.

The curriculum is established by the learners in consultation with program staff and learner supporters. Each learner has a Continuous Learning Plan (CLP) which addresses the learner's individual learning style, skills, abilities and interests, and the requirements of the State of Minnesota and Spring Lake Park School District.

Curriculum is developed with three guiding principles: take learners where they are, focus on the learner as a whole person, and guide academic progress toward applicable skills and the awarding of a diploma.

## CHILD CARE SERVICES
